

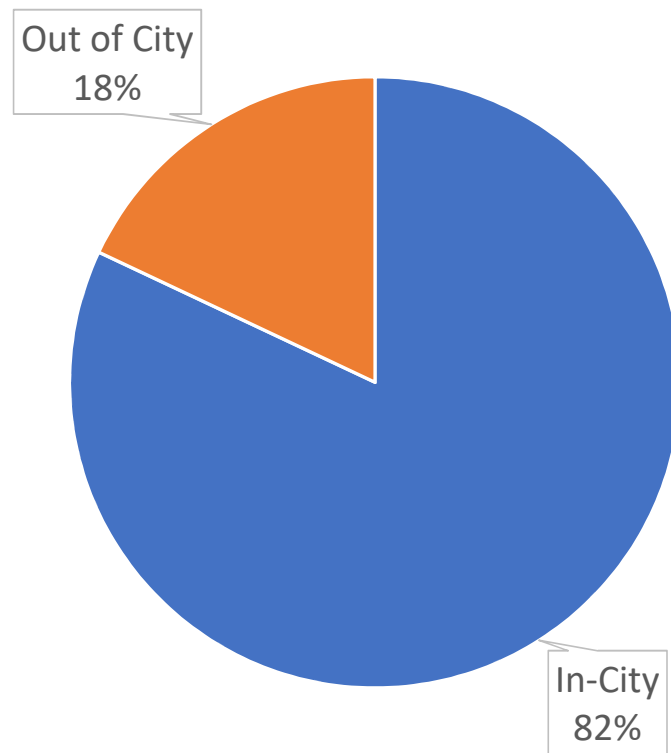

Who responded?

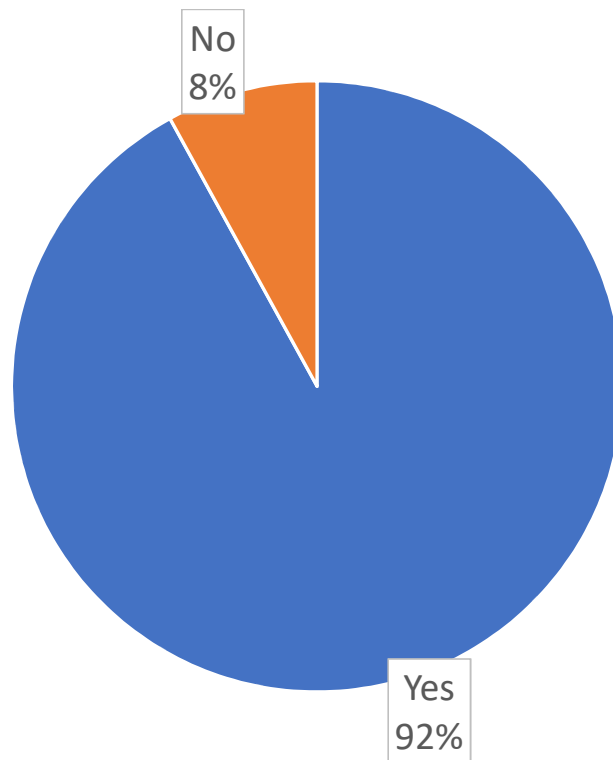

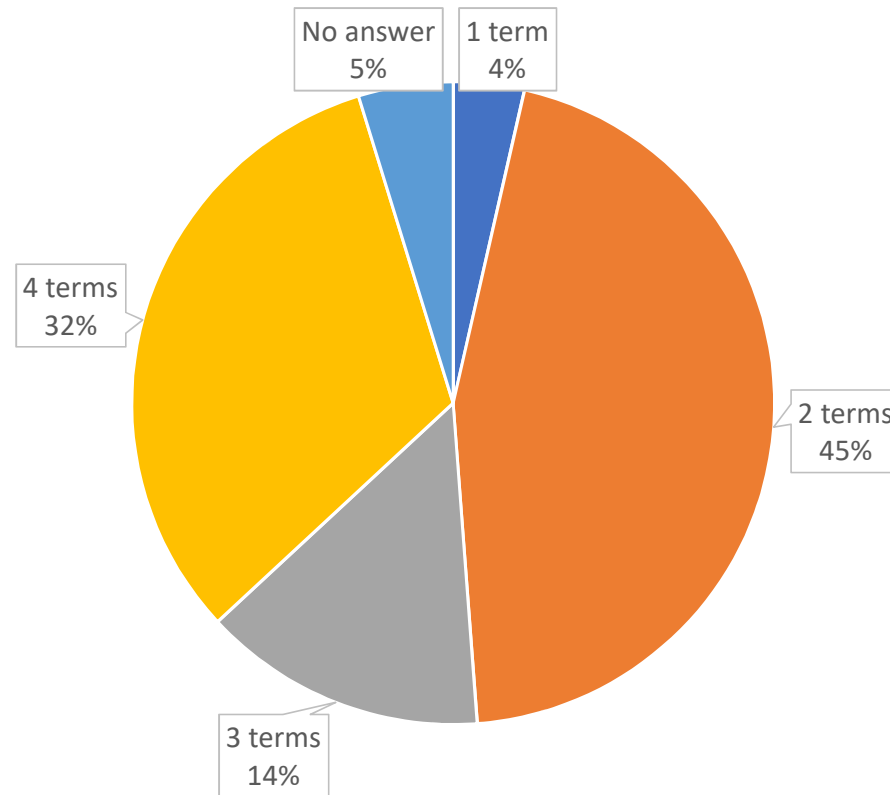

(within city limits)

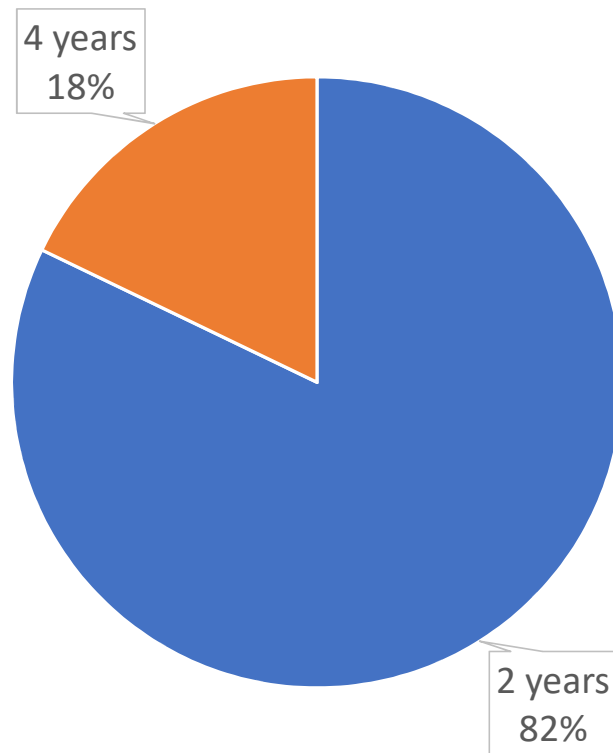
Should the Charter add term limits for City Councilors?



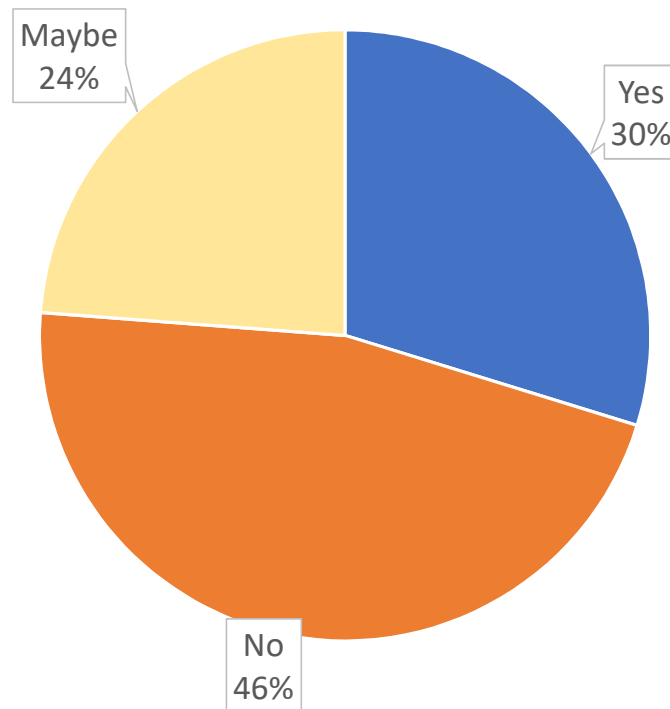
What should be the maximum number of terms that a Councilor could serve?



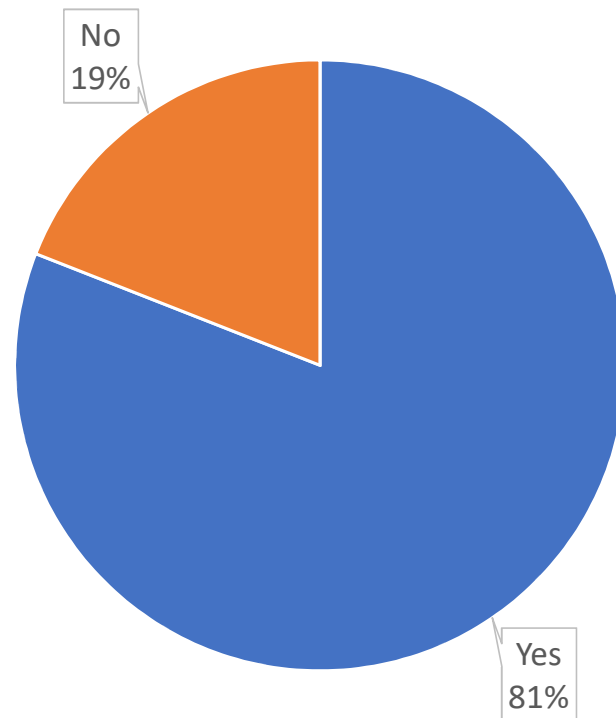
How long should terms be?



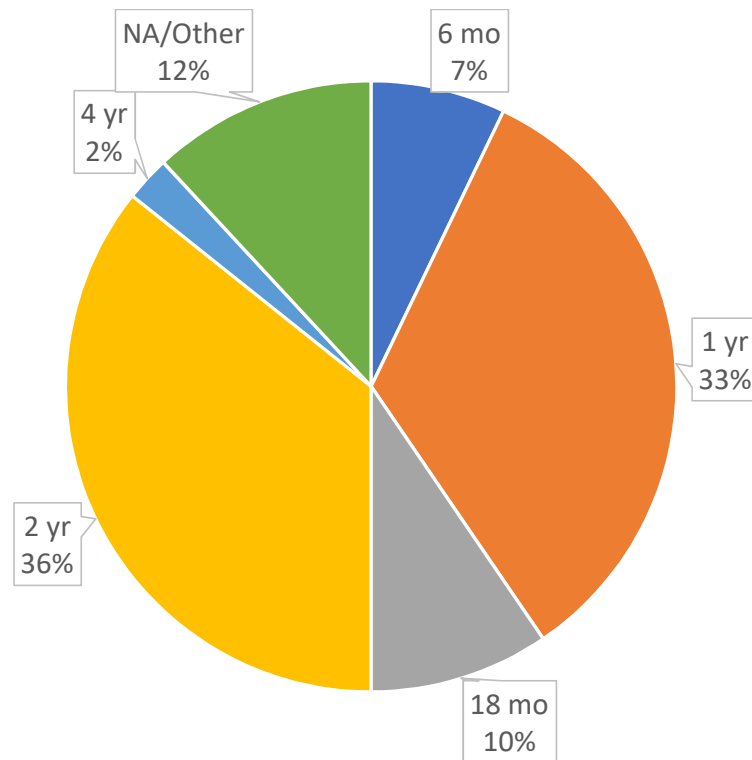
Should a councilor who has maxed out on term limits be allowed to run again after some absence from the Council?

How long should the residency requirement be?



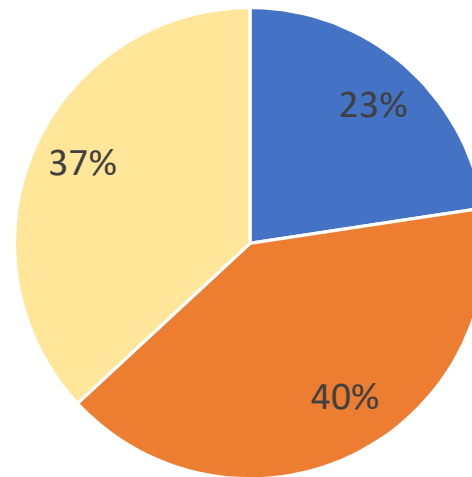
Should the Charter be amended to add districts?

- Yes. All Council seats should represent a specific district with no at-large seats.

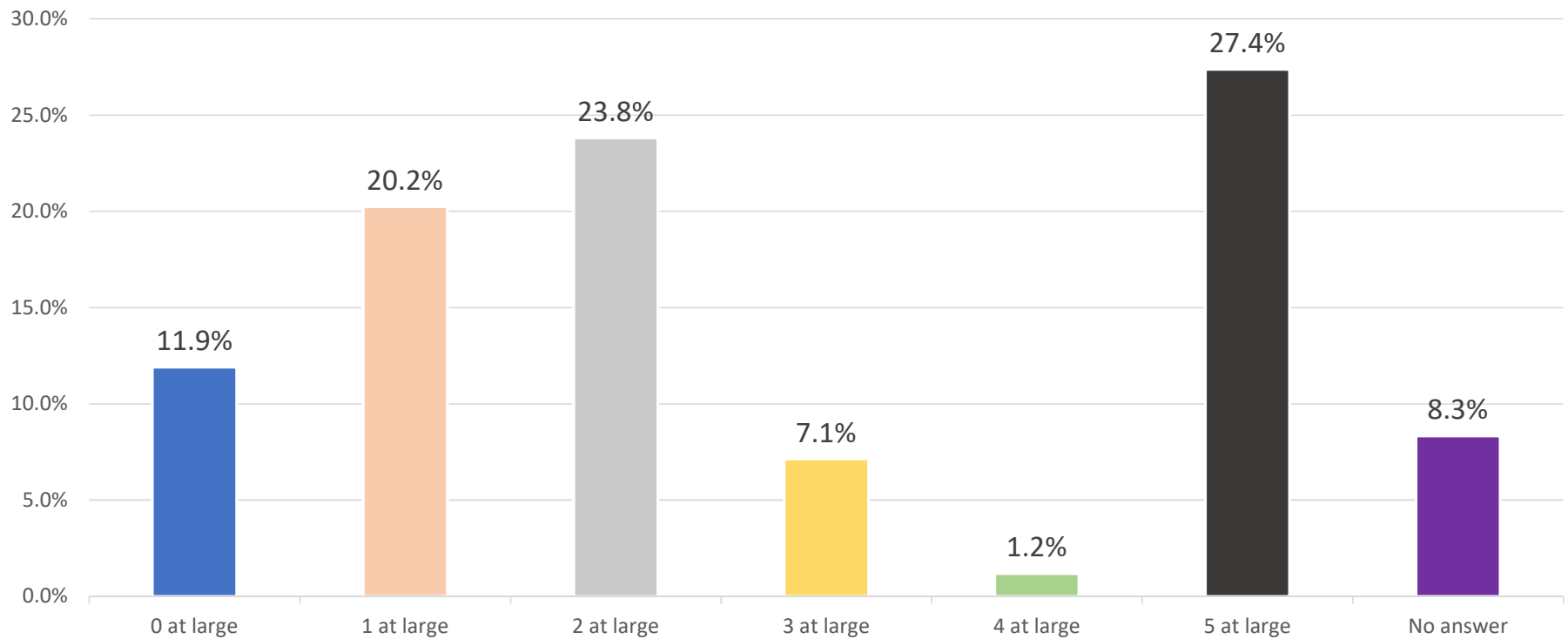
Should the Charter be amended to add districts?

How many at-large seats do you feel there should be on a 5-member council?

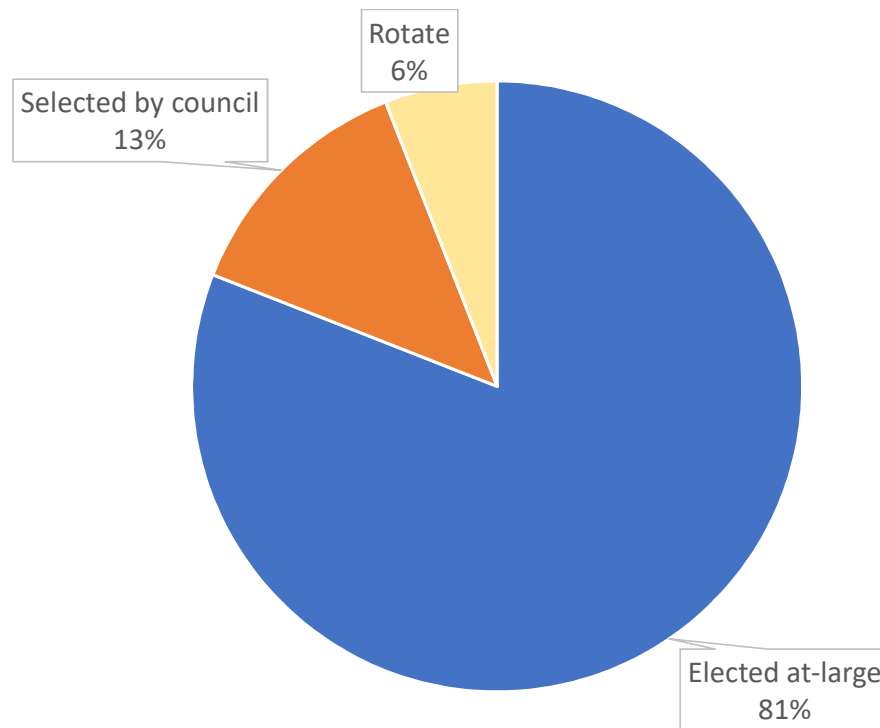


How should the Mayor's seat be handled?

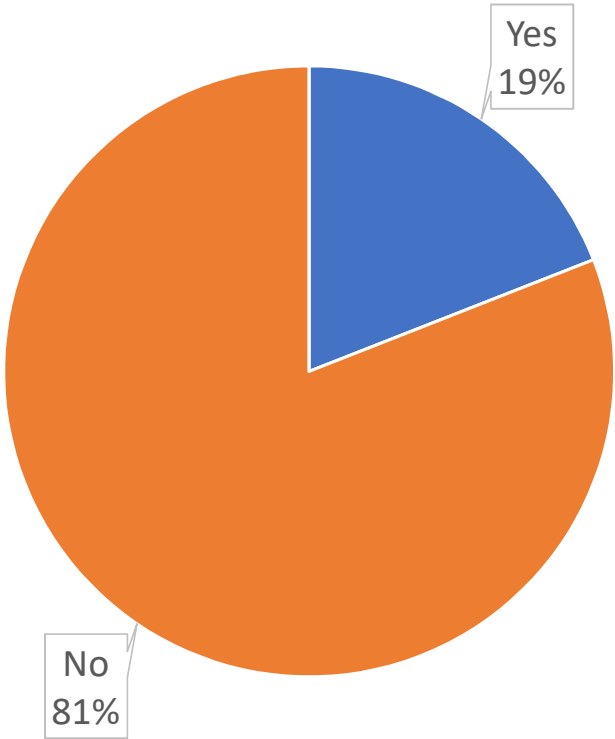
The exact wording of the choices was:

Should the Council change the handling of vacancies?

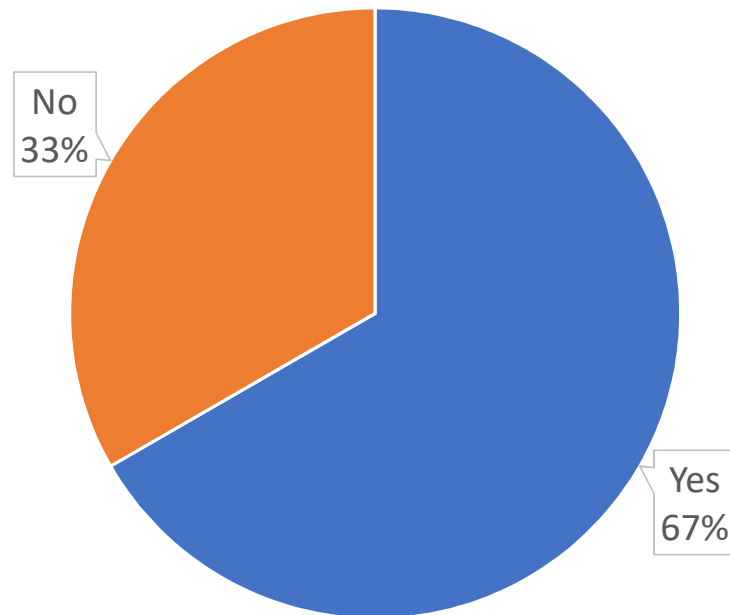


Should the Charter be changed to create a Board of Adjustment?
